

JESSIE OWENS PARK BOARD MEETING
SEPTEMBER 8 , 1994, 4:00 P.M.
MOULTON

The Jessie Owens Park Board met September 8 at the Extension Office in Moulton.

James Pinion open the discussion by informing Board Members that a resolution had been signed at Colonial Bank in Moulton by he (James Pinion) and Therman White which attested that the Park Board was a non-profit organization. Therman White and James Pinion are also the authorizing signatures for checks written from the Board's account.

Therman White reported that metal back boards are being assembled for the basket ball goals. The Board purchased the materials for the back-boards, however free labor is being donated by a local group to put the back-boards up.

The Park has received a Land and Water grant in the of \$80,000 and a matching (50/50) grant from ARC in the amount of \$75,000.00. The ARC grant is to be used for the statue.

TVA will conduct a feasibility study, hopefully in October.

The County Commission is in the process of trying to get liability insurance for volunteers working at the park. At present, if a volunteer gets hurt while working at the park the Board could be liable.

Paula Hovater has set up a reception on Sept 23, in Birmingham with Dr. Leroy Walker who is President of the Olympic Committee.

Mrs. Hovater has also set up a meeting with the Jessie Owens' family in Chicago on 10-10-94.

The purpose of this meeting is to update Mrs. Owens on the park progress and to solicit her input, assistance and support with the museum. The meeting will also let the Owens family know that the Board is not soliciting money from them, only their support for the Park project.

Clarence Pointer, former East Lawrence student is interested in doing some drawings for the museum.

Discussion and clarification on the use of the official Olympic rings will be needed for the statue before it is constructed.
