The following is a list of Lawrence County transportation department and school bus pickup points and parking areas in Moulton for the Jesse Owens Memorial Park dedication Saturday. Each department will furnish 25 buses.

Buses begin departing at 8:30 a.m., followed by departures at 9:10, 9:40, 10:10 and 10:30. Passengers should board the first bus at 8:15 and the ride to Oakville takes approximately 21 minutes.

There will be a limited amount of parking available near the Owens park, but the roads will be closed half a mile before the park on County Roads 203 and 187; the walk from the entrance of the park to center-stage is at least another half mile. Also, the park is handicap accessible and provisions for persons with physical disabilities will be provided by the volunteers at the park.

OAKVILLE — For viewers of the Jesse Owens Park Dedication and Olympic Torch Relay looking to quench their thirst Saturday, there's one thing to remember — Coke is it.

The Coca-Cola Bottling Co. will place highly visible Coca-Cola and Olympic logos on 10-by-12-foot trailers so patrons can easily find their way to sales of cold 20-ounce bottles of Coke Classic and Diet Coke. The drinks will be served cold and sell for \$1. Cups and ice will not be available.
